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

Located at the very heart of the Coral Triangle, Puerto Galera is well known for its numerous scuba diving sites and has some of the most diverse coral reef diving in all of Asia. The area also features numerous pocket beaches and stunning tropical scenery. Centrally located only minutes from Puerto Galera's prime dives and with a beautiful beach front location, Atlantis Puerto Galera is beautifully built into the hills of Sabang Beach. In many travel guidebooks and magazines, Atlantis is described as one of the most outstanding resorts in the Philippines and the Grand Dame of Puerto Galera resorts.

ne of the oldest Spanish settlements in the Philippines, Puerto Galera was founded in 1574 when it became the first provincial capital on Mindoro Island. As early as the 10th century, Chinese, Malay and Indonesian merchants were already doing business with local traders, as Puerto Galera was where they replenished their provisions. In 2005, Puerto Galera hit the international tourism limelight when it was given "The Most Beautiful Bay in the World" award by UNESCO as only the third bay in Southeast Asia to receive this prestigious rating.

GETTING HERE

Puerto Galera lies on the northern tip of the island of Oriental Mindoro, approximately 110km south of Manila.

ROUTES

- Accessible from Manila or any part of Luzon by van to Batangas (approximately two hours from Manila) and then boat to Puerto Galera (approximately one hour).
- Also accessible from Manila via sea plane (9 passengers); flight time approximately forty minutes.

DID YOU KNOW?

Puerto Galera was founded in 1574 as the original capital of Mindoro. The town was popularly known as "Puerto Galera' (Port of the Galleons). Spanish galleons coming from Mexico and Spain used the presence of an excellent natural port to take refuge during stormy weather. The bay remains a refuge for ferries and other vessels during storms to this day.

Mindoro is the seventh-largest island in the Philippines. In past times it was called Ma-i or Mait by ancient Chinese traders and, as Mina de Oro (meaning 'gold-mine") by Spaniards. This is where the island's modernday name came from. In 1942, the Japanese Air Force and Naval Auxiliary occupied the town. Mindoro's Mount Halcon rises to 2,586 meters (8,482 ft) and is the 18th highest peak in the Philippines. Its slopes have earned it the honor of being the most difficult mountain in the country to climb.

Sabang is one of Puerto Galera's twelve coastal districts (or Barangays). On December 26, 1973, PD 354 was issued by President Ferdinand E. Marcos making Puerto Galera a reservation area under the Man and Biosphere Program of the UNESCO. Most people who refer to diving in "Puerto Galera" are actually talking about Sabang Beach as the prime diving spots are located in Sabang.

While English is spoken by most and taught in all levels of education, the principal language is Tagalog. Mindoro Island is separated from Luzon by the Verde Island Passage. Claimed by many to be the center of marine biodiversity in Asia, the waters are flushed by the current of the West Philippine Sea. This results in strong currents of up to 6 knots making the area well known for its spectacularly exhilarating drift dives. Puerto Galera boasts of having over 180 species of nudibranchs along with numerous species of fishes and turtles.

Behind the beaches are the huge and generally unexplored mountain ranges of central Mindoro. Mangyan tribes are scattered over the mountain sides with some of the more remote tribes having virtually no contact with the outside world. Of the eight tribes on Mindoro, the Iraya is the largest. The tribe is based in the Puerto Galera area.

Jeepneys are the most popular means of public transportation in the area (and in the Philippines). They were originally made from US military jeeps left over from World War II and are known for their flamboyant decoration and crowded seating. They have become a ubiquitous symbol of Philippine culture.



On a long peaceful stretch of sandy beach and just a thirty minute drive from the airport is where you will find the lush and luxurious Atlantis Dive Resort - Dumaguete. Surrounded by an amazing tropical garden with some of the rarest plants to be found in the Philippines, the resort is just a short trip to some of the most renowned dive sites in Asia - Apo Island, Siquijor and, of course, the local Dauin Marine Sanctuaries.

tlantis Dumaguete is located in the municipality of Dauin (pronounced Da-win), the capital, principal seaport and largest city in the province. The epicenter of Dumaguete's dive scene is Negros Island, the third largest island in the Philippines. The island is believed to have once been part of the island of Mindanao, but was cut off - either by continental drift or the rising waters at the end of the Ice Age. Dauin has several established sanctuaries, a reason why we have such stunning

marine biodiversity. Fishing and boating in the sanctuaries is absolutely prohibited. This includes sites such as Mainit, Luca, Dauin and Masaplod. These sites are well preserved and offer an enormous diversity of life forms; including the blue ringed octopus, wonderpus, mimic octopus, poison ocellate octopus, Ambon scorpionfish, flamboyant cuttlefish, and bobbit worms that are regularly encountered.

DID YOU KNOW?

umaguete is called the "The City of Gentle People". It is a college town with a warm atmosphere and an air of sophistication.

The city's name is derived from the word 'dumaguit' which in English means 'to snatch'. This name suggests it has the power to charm visitors and keep them from ever wanting to leave.

Dumaguete is the capital of Negros Oriental with a population of more than 120,000 people. The city is home to Silliman University, the first university outside of Manila, and several other first-class universities.

Atlantis, located in Dauin, has become the epicenter of diving in the Dumaguete area due to the immense biodiversity and world class macro photography. Our whale shark day trip is also very popular with our guests providing the rare opportunity to dive with these gentle giants.

Apo Island is home to over 650 documented species of fish and is estimated to have over 400 species of corals. Most of the Philippines 450 species of coral, from tiny bubble corals to huge gorgonian sea fans and brain corals, can be found here.

The local language in Negros is Visayan. The power source of the city comes from the geothermal power plant in Palinpinon, Valencia.

The most popular form of transport in the city is the "pedicab" although they no longer have pedals. The answer to how many people can fit on one is, "one more".





Our Tubbataha seasons runs from mid-March through early June – explore miles in this pristine protected UNESCO World Heritage site located 100 miles offshore and open to diving only 3 months out of the year.

TRIP INFORMATION

TUBBATAHA REEF

Tubbataha Reef is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and only accessible by liveaboard three months a year. Located 100 miles offshore and made up of North and South Atolls and Jessie Beazley Atoll, the area's pristine reefs are protected by rangers year-round. Divers can experience wonderful visibility and some of the best diving the Philippines has to offer from March through June each year.

NORTHERN TIP OF NORTH ATOLL

Fissures and crevices lead divers to nurse and whitetip reef sharks that are resting during the day. Small manta rays, stingrays, spotted eagle rays, and turtles are commonly encountered. The wall supports huge gorgonian fan corals, soft corals and barrel sponges. Blacktip, whitetip and grey reef sharks are often seen as they patrol the reefs.

SOUTHERN END OF NORTH ATOLL

Malayan, Wallstreet and Amos Rock are the pick of the dive sites. Fans of macro life will enjoy these sites with sightings of Denise pygmy seahorses clinging to the sea fans, resting scorpionfish, moray eels and even ghost pipefish. Don't worry pelagic fans, you can still see huge dogtooth tuna, sharks and Spanish makerel in the blue.

NORTHERN TIP OF SOUTH ATOLL

Highlights include Black Rock, T Wreck and Eiger Wall. You will likely lose count of the number of green and hawksbill turtles in the area. Keep an eye out for marble stingrays in the sand. Eagle rays often cruise by, and you will likely see larger grouper and giant trevally.

SOUTHERN END OF SOUTH ATOLL

This area is known for its lighthouse and is home to famous dive sites of Delsan Wreck and Black Rock. Hammerheads and an occasional whale shark passing by are the most prized sightings here. Look out for guitar sharks in the shallows.

SOUTH END OF NORTH ATOLL

The dive starts on a gentle slope that is covered with pristine corals and ends at a wall covered with magnificent gorgonian fans where keen-eyed divers often spot pygmy seahorses. If there's current, you'll come across a wide variety of large fish, including Spanish mackerel, giant trevally, red snapper, Napoleon wrasse and giant groupers. You're almost certain to see whitetip and grey reef sharks.

You will want to keep an eye out for manta rays, spotted eagle rays and both green and hawksbill turtles closer to the surface. Other fish that can be seen include rainbow





runners, African pompano, angelfish, leaf scorpionfish, fire dartfish and down deeper, decorated dartfish.

JESSIE BEAZLEY REEF

The charters finish with a couple of dives at Jessie Beazley Reef where you can see schools of bumphead parrotfish munching on the corals. Look for inquisitive Napoleon wrasse. The shallow reefs are alive with uncountable numbers of colorful, tropical fishes including the regal angelfish and titan triggerfish.

BOHOL

The Visayas are one of the three island groups in the Philippines. Enjoy six fabulous days diving from the Atlantis Azores around one of the most beautiful and bio-diverse regions in Asia. Easy cruises each evening will take you from one great dive site to another. With quick transfers directly from our beautiful Dumaguete resort, consider a combo trip with Atlantis Dumaguete for a multiple week, first class dive vacation at a very reasonable price. - Day 1 & 2: Moalboal Pescador Island
- Day 3: Oslob and Sumilon Island
- Day 4: Balicasag Island
- Day 5: Balicasag Island and/or Panglao Island
- Day 6: Half a day diving Apo Island or Siquijor
- Day 7: Disembark at Atlantis Dumaguete

MOALBOAL - PESCADOR

Rated as one of the Philippines top dive sites for many years, this small island is just a couple of miles due west of Moalboal. The exhilarating scene is set by a small plateau that surrounds the island before it drops vertically into the abyss. The wall is literally teeming with life; frogfish, stonefish, barracuda and turtles are commonly seen, but the real draw is the sardine run and chance of a thresher shark!

OSLOB AND SUMILON ISLAND

We spend the 3rd day snorkeling with whale sharks at Oslob. The rest of the day will be spent surrounded by crystal clear diving around tranquil Sumilon Island where you will fall in love with the area's azure waters and pristine white sand beaches. You will enjoy exquisite coral gardens and drop-offs. 'Might sees' in this area include manta rays and stingrays, barracudas, sea turtles and sea snakes, and the occasional whale and hammerhead sharks.

BALICASAG ISLAND

Balicasag is a flat island located four kilometers southwest of the Duijo Point where the sandy coralline beach is a site to behold. Keep an eye out for the abundant schools of jacks, mackerel and barracudas as well as large groupers, Napoleon wrasses and snappers hiding in the over hangs of the dramatic coral encrusted vertical walls that plummet into the depths.

PANGLAO ISLAND

Lying in the middle of the Visayas, Bohol is the tenth largest island of the Philippines. Look for turtles, whitetip and blacktip reef sharks, eagle and manta rays, schooling barracuda and trevally, frogfish, ghost pipefish, pygmy and thorny seahorses along with many species of nudibranchs on the dramatic walls and reefs.

APO ISLAND

Apo Island is one of the world's best known community-organized marine sanctuaries. The island is home to over 650 documented species of fishes and is estimated to have over 400 species of corals.

SIQUIJOR

Called Isla del Fuego, or the 'Island of Fire" by the Spanish, Siquijor is considered by many Filipinos to be a mystical





island that is full of witches and other supernatural phenomena. Look for magnificent hard and soft corals, colorful schools of fusiliers, nudibranchs, clownfish, parrotfish, schools of juvenile barracuda and razorfish. Super pristine walls abound!

LAND EXCURSION

Our mid-week land excursion is not to be missed. After two morning dives you still have time to take in some of the best sites on Bohol. The Chocolate Hills are probably Bohol's most famous tourist attraction. They look like giant mole hills covered with grass that turns chocolate brown at the end of the dry season. We also look for Tarsiers, the world's smallest primate, and visit a unique butterfly farm. You can finish by exploring Alona Beach, a lovely setting famous for its white coral sand.

ATLANTIS AZORES

APO REEF & WRECKS OF CORON

Atlantis Azores latest exciting itinerary centers upon the sunken World War II wrecks of Coron Bay via Apo Reef. A typical charter starts with a cruise to Apo Reef, a destination referred to by many as a "mini-Tubbataha" where you will spend two days exploring the 34-mile long reef system.

Twenty four Japanese ships were sunk in Coron Bay on September 24, 1944 by the US Navy. You will have an opportunity to dive the best of these during our time there as you take in the area's unique history and the amazing fish and coral life that now cover the wrecks.

DIVE DAY SCHEDULE

- Day 1 & 2: Apo Reef
- Day 3 & 4: Wrecks of Coron
- Day 5: Nanshin Maru and Dimipac Island
- Day 6: Kyokuszan Maru

DAY 1 & 2 - APO REEF AND TARA ISLANDS

Apo Reef is our destination for the first day. Apo Reef is the second largest contiguous coral reef in the world and the largest one in the Philippines. Shark Ridge is a great place to see whitetip and blacktip reef sharks. Manta rays are spotted here as well as hawksbill turtles and bumphead parrot fish. Binangaan Drop Off is another fantastic location with huge schools of snappers and tuna. Look for spotted eagle rays in the blue as well as other pelagic species. At the end of our second day, we'll offer an optional visit to Coron's hot springs.


DAY 3 & 4 - CORON WRECKS

Coron is a mecca for wreck divers. We begin to explore the Japanese shipwrecks from World War II with Okikawa Maru, a 160-meter ship which was sunk by a direct hit on the bow area and Olympia Maru, a massive 137-meter army cargo ship. A shallow dive on East Tangat gunboat, a 40-meter submarine hunter, is ideal for exploration. The big attraction is the two main boilers covered with extensive hard coral growth. Divers can also find plentiful scorpionfish on the decks. We will also explore Akitsusima, a warship and one of Coron's most famous dives, and Irako, a 147-meter refrigeration ship for the Japanese Imperial Navy.

DAY 5 - NANSHIN MARU DIMIPAC ISLAND

Nanshin Maru, or Black Island Wreck, is a small tanker converted to take fuels from the Japanese Imperial Army. She is approximately 50-meters long sitting upright on a sandy bottom. Marine life includes large scorpionfish, lionfish, and many more varieties of small to huge fishes such as schools of batfish, sweepers and trumpetfish. You can also see angelfish (emperor and six-banded), sponges, hydroids and crinoids.

We then dive Dimipac Island, offering relaxed diving with sandy slopes on which you may encounter turtles, dendritic jawfish, leaf scorpionfish, ribbon eels - and who knows, maybe a dugong! The water around the island is relatively warm with very little current and offering heavenly photo opportunities!



DAY 6 - KYOKUSZAN MARU

We begin our 6th day with two deeper morning dives at Kyokuszan in Maricaban Bay off the island of Busuanga, Coron. Kyokuzan was an auxiliary supply ship of the Japanese Royal Navy sunk by a US carrier-based aircraft. She is approximately 140-meters long, with beautiful corals grown over various car parts, tires, and encrusting the body of the ship. We then cruise back to Puerto Galera.

Six fluorescent wall lights provide additional illumination. The room also has two internet-ready desktop PC's for guests to view their photos.

The camera area is climate controlled and also has a 42-inch HD flat screen TV with both HDMI and USB connections mounted on the wall. Guests can view and show off their photos and videos on the big screen at the end of a great day of diving.




